A LEED Materials Guide on Terrazzo Aggregates



RECYCLE/REUSE

As one of the first "green" flooring systems, terrazzo is composed of marble, recycled glass, plastic, or shell chips set in a cement or epoxy binder. Today's construction industry has revolutionized their building practices by setting goals to use more sustainable or environmentally-friendly building materials. Finishes like terrazzo are evaluated on their overall "green" value, factoring in elements such as a material's longevity, recycled contents and ease of maintenance.

Terrazzo brings together durability, design aesthetics, design flexibility, and low maintenance needs, which can create a complete life cycle flooring surface. Architects and designers can obtain LEED credits from the United States Green Building Council (USGBC). A great way to contribute to LEED points is by selecting the proper aggregate.

LEED CREDITS

LEED, or Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design was created by the U.S. Green Building Council, which allows projects to seek LEED certification for addressing sustainability issues.

MRc4.1-4.2: Recycled Content

LEED points can be earned by using recycled glass or aggregates salvaged from buildings and reused later in projects. Based on material cost, 1 point is awarded if 10% of recycled content is present in the overall value of materials on the project. An additional point is awarded if 20% of the recycled content is present.

MRc5.1-5.2: Regionally-Sourced Materials

LEED points can be earned if 10% of a material is extracted, harvested or recovered, and manufactured within 500 miles of a project's site. Additional point is awarded if the total percentage of the cost of regional materials exceeds 20%.
